



2018 Guess the Birdies Contest Rules

1. NO PLEDGE, PURCHASE OR DONATION REQUIRED.
2. Void where prohibited by law. Need not be present to win.
3. Winner must be 18 years as of October 23, 2017 to be eligible to win the grand prize.
4. Contest entry forms are limited to no more than 50 per person.
5. Handwriting is the responsibility of the donors. The Valero Texas Open staff is not responsible for errors.
6. Only guesses submitted on Official Pledge Forms, or completed online will be accepted. NO exceptions.
7. The exact number of birdies counted will include birdies made in the Monday and Wednesday pro-ams held on the AT&T Oaks Course, Saturday pro-am (AT&T Canyons Course) and Thursday - Sunday of the official competition by PGA TOUR pros. Birdies made by the amateur pro-am teams on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday will also be included in the final tabulation.
8. The final number of birdies made will be determined and validated by the PGA TOUR.
9. Only one (1) Grand Prize will be awarded. The Grand Prize will be given to the person who exactly guesses the number of birdies made during the defined measurement period. In case of ties, a winner will be chosen at random from all official entries received by the established deadline date and bearing the correct guess for that number of birdies, or by a contest to be determined by the Valero Texas Open. If no one guesses the exact number of birdies, the winner will be randomly selected by the computer.
10. "Guess the Birdies Contest" entry deadline is Monday, April 16, 2018.
11. Prizes cannot be exchanged for cash.
12. Winners are responsible for all sales tax, other applicable fees, and income tax on all prizes.
13. Employees of the Valero Texas Open and their immediate family members are not eligible for the Grand Prize.
14. The Valero Texas Open staff's decisions and interpretations of the rules will be final and made at their sole and absolute discretion. No appeal or further review will be permitted.
15. These rules may be amended at any time at the sole and absolute discretion of the Valero Texas Open.
